METIS CHILDREN AND YOUTH IN CARE HAVE RIGHTS

- to be fed, clothed and nurtured
- to be informed about their plans
- to express their views
- to have privacy
- to possess personal belongings
- to be free from corporal punishment
- to be informed of behaviour expected and caregiver responses
- to receive medical and dental care
- to participate in social and recreational activities
- to receive religious instruction
- to receive guidance, encouragement and support to learn about and practice their Metis traditions, customs and languages
- to belong to their Metis communities
- to be provided with an interpreter
- to have privacy during discussions with family, lawyer, or others
- to be informed of their rights and how to enforce them
